## **The Carroll Family**

We wanted to convey to you a story of sadness with a touching outcome that was made possible by the compassion and generosity of two of the funds loyal supporters.

This wonderful young family on Cape Cod, who previously adopted two brothers, were presented with the opportunity

to adopt their younger sister who was newly born. They jumped at the chance and opened up their home to take her in. They felt strongly that the siblings should be united and grow up together in the same home with loving parents. Soon after, tragedy struck,

and the father of the

family had a massive heart

attack and died. The children understandably are struggling emotionally and behaviorally with the loss of their father. The boys were especially close as their father was the only stable male influence they have known.

When we were made aware of this tragedy, we scheduled a



visit to meet the mother and her children to see how we could help. In a combined effort, Joe Ananstasi and Tom Ruane, two of the fund's key supporters immediately came forward to offer their assistance.

Joe Anastasi came with us to visit the family to understand what their needs might be. With

> input from the mother, we determined that a program of counseling and therapy would be beneficial to the children.

> We then expedited a grant from Stone Adoption to address this need. The fund extends a big thank you to Joe and Tom for helping to make this possible.

## **The Colon Family**

This morning I had the pleasure of meeting with Antonio and Marissa Colon and their soon to be adopted son, Romeo. Antonio is a corrections officer and Marissa is a hairdresser. They live in a modest house in a quiet neighborhood that Marissa grew up in and is perfect for children.

Romeo is just three and has cerebral palsy. He is a happy child, obviously

well-loved, is alert and beginning to talk. Romeo is Marissa's nephew (her sister's son) and has been living in their home for the past two and one half years. Their devotion to his well being and progress is clear.

Romeo wears braces on his lower legs, with which he is able to walk with the aid of a walker. He has an electric wheelchair which will be

Welcome to the ninth edition of the Stone Family Adoption Assistance Fund annual newsletter. We would like to give a special thank you to Deb Estelle and Nancy Solow of Adoption Journeys whose tireless efforts have lead us to many of the adoptive families we have helped this year.

Over the past three years the success of our Annual Appeal has encouraged us to continue it. This is our only fundraising event and we fund all our assistance to adoptive families through this effort. Please read the cover

letter and the newsletter section for the details on how you can continue to support us. We can't make these wonderful stories happen without you and we hope that you will join us in our mission to help the large number of families in the adoptive community that need our assistance.

As you know, except for minor administrative expenses like postage and required report filings, 100% of your donation goes directly to families. 
This is a special young family and I urge the Fund to help with this essential item.
