A Message From Ed Stone, Chairman

Welcome to the 11th edition of the Stone Family Adoption Assistance Fund annual newsletter. As in prior years we have many new stories to tell you about how your generosity has helped to change the lives of deserving adoptive children and families. This was a difficult year for all of us due to the Covid pandemic. We did, however, manage to assist eight families with their adoption needs. The coming year holds great promise as we have a backlog of families with requests for aid. My hope is that you will continue to support us in changing the lives of these adoptive families.



In Andrew's memory, The Stone Family Adoption Assistance Fund provided grants to eight families this year. In addition to awarding grants to pay for



adoption fees and home studies, we helped families with various needs such as speech and occupational therapy, autism therapy, special education and learning tools, and economic hardship with special needs children. We continue to be a sponsor of Wonderfund Adoption Events where children in the foster care system can be introduced to parents looking to adopt. We have seen much success from these events and have awarded grants to families that have adopted children they were introduced to at these events.

Over the past five years the success of our Annual Appeal has encouraged us to continue it. This is our only fundraising event and we fund all our assistance to adoptive families through this effort. Please read the cover letter and the newsletter



section for the details on how you can continue to support us. We can't make these wonderful stories happen without you and we hope that you will join us in our mission to help the large number of families in the adoptive community that need our assistance.

As you know, except for minor administrative expenses like postage and required report filings, 100% of your donation goes directly to families.



The Harrigan Family

Yesterday, Sharon and I visited Melissa and Chris Harrigan at their modest but neat ranch in Medway. They were beaming with joy and eager to show off their new, 8-week- old baby, Gus. Melissa is the religious Ed coordinator for a church in Needham and Chris works in IT. After several years of trying unsuccessfully to have a baby, Melissa and Chris decided adoption was their best route. They spoke

very highly of the agency they chose, Adoption With Love. Shortly before Thanksgiving, they were notified that a birth mother had awarded them the opportunity to adopt her soon-to-be born son. In an unusual twist the birth mother was a married, Methadone using, 39-year-old grandmother.

Realizing that she and her husband could not appropriately care for another child, she put her baby up for adoption. The Harrigan's were invited to witness the birth which they were eager to do. They flew to Nashville and spent over three weeks in Nashville, bonding with the birth family, witnessing the birth (an incredible experience), and holding Gus almost 24 hours a day for a week during his withdrawal from Methadone. Gus is now happy, healthy and almost sleeping through the night.



Melissa and Chris impressed us as loving parents who will provide a caring home for Gus. In summary, Melissa and Chris have all the attributes we are trying to promote at Stone Adoption.

The expenses of adoption, including travel expenses, have put a financial strain on Melissa and Chris. We believe their situation meets the core of our mission and would recommend they receive a grant.
